In a globalized world, we are inevitably part of a connected network system facing dramatic transformation in professional, socio-economic and political areas. Development of sustainable health and wellness service delivery.

As a CEO and Director of a community clinic called the <u>Institute for Multicultural Counseling and Education Services (IMCES)</u>, I developed an integrated model of service delivery, including mental health, primary health care, substance abuse, and social services to help culturally diverse underserved groups in our community to reach their recovery and resiliency status. IMCES offers twelve clinical programs developed to reach children, youth, families, and adults who have many barriers to their wellness, success, and sustainability within the community. Our treatment philosophy focuses on strengths rather than pathology, on wellness rather than illness. IMCES recognizes the need to address the severity of illness in our community. Also, we have developed a comprehensive model of services delivery, which provides culturally proficient services to all ages and ethnicities based on the proven success of integrated and coordinated services. This is accomplished through the utilization of advocacy, outreach and engagement and prevention and early intervention strategies.

- Internationalizing Psychology:
 - National and international clinical training programs

IMCES developed an international clinical training program which is accredited by the American Psychological Association (APA). IMCES has a long history of providing specialized graduate level training. Our clinical training program is designed to promote the specialty area of "community clinic" and integrated model of service delivery. Our training is focused on integrating primary physical health and mental health. In addition, we have made a special effort to promote and encourage the internationalization of psychology by providing clinical training on a global level and promoting research and fostering international connections among psychologists. We are members of the InterExchange which is designed by the US Department of State to promote crosscultural awareness through work and volunteer exchange programs.

Through this strengthened network and partnership we are able to promote the United Nations' initiative of the <u>Alliance of Civilization</u>. Our goal is <u>uncovering unity in diversity</u>, creating leadership opportunities to honor the human rights of everyone and empower the <u>SPIRIT OF UNITY</u>.
